# TARIFF RATES ON SHIPS AND CARGO HANDLING SERVICES 1985

# CHAPTER I

# GENERAL — OUTLINE

Set below are the principal charges and rates levied on ships and Cargo passing through the major Somali Ports of Mogadishu, Berbera, and Kismayu.

These rates and charges are shown in tabulations drawn up in the sequence of alphabetical order. A number of rules and conditions applying thereto are also enumerated.

# CHAPTER II

Shore Handling/Lighterage

# Article I

# Chageable Unit

- 1. All charges on shore handling or Lighterage will be calculated on the deadweight.
- 2. All charges in this tariff where the basis is on deadweight, shall be raised in units of 1000 Kilogrames (Ton) or part there of

- 3. Any fraction of a ton will be treated as whole number Ton which is the lowest chargeable unit.
- 4. Where information in the official shipping documents appears to be insufficient or doubtful, the Port Authority reserves the right to make cheek weighment on spot measurement, and shore handling or lighterage charges will be assessed on which ever is greater so obtained.
  - 5. All Ship charges are payable in US.\$. only.

# Article 2 Empty Containers

Empty containers when loaded or discharged will be charged as general cargo items at full rates as shown in table (W) of this tariff.

# Article 3 Surcharges

- 1. All dirty cargo that may leave stains, contaminating effects or damages on the surface of work aprons or storage areas, will be charged a surcharge of 30% on the normal handling rates shown in table (N). The Somali Ports Authority is empowered to determine which cargoes can be classified dirty cargo.
- 2. Timber blanked discharged o rloaded in loose pieces or insufficiently packed will be charge of 35% on the ordinary rates specified in table (N) of this tariff.

# Article 4 Rebate and Reduction

The aim of this article is to encourage the port users to make use of the cargo unitised system, such as:-

- a) Timber in hard pressed budnles,
- b) Pre Palletized goods,
- c) Pre-slung Cargo.

Therefore, if a complete consignment (Specified B/L Quantity) is delivered direct from the ship's rail in consistent with one of the above mentioned unitised cargo system, without engaging port labourers for stac-

king in the ship's harches or dismentling on the trucks, with the exception of the hooking and unhooking arebate of 5% will be allowed on the ordinary handling rate in table (N) of this tariff on application. The applicant should submit his claim request within 30 Days beginning from the day the discharging/Loading commenced.

# CHAPTER III

Stevedoring or Handling on Board

# Article 5

# Basis of assesment

- 1. Stevedoring or handling on board charges will be assessed on the deadweight for all goods except life animals which are based on the in-dividual heads as specified in table M1.
- 2. Subject to conditions in the terms of carriage between the cons-gnee and the carrier, settlement of stevedoring chares will be the responsibility of the vessel unless a written indemnity is received by the Somali Ports Authority sufficiently in advance before the delivery order is issued.
- 3. Overtime operations on board ships will be effected to discharge or load goods only after a written application has been received from the ship's master or this agent.
- 4. Overtime charges on Stevedoring operation as shown in table (L) of this tariff will be come due on the following times:-

Normal Day= 14.00 Hrs - 06.00 HrsFriday and other Holidays = 06.00 - 06.00 Hrs.

CHAPTER IV

Port Dues and Entrance Charges

Article 6

Application

Port dues, entrance charges will 1

# Article 7

1. Ships wholly owned by the Somali Government will be allowed a reduction of 50% on the rates specified in tables (B&C) of this tariff.

2. Ships wholly owned by Somali Nationals (Private Sectors) will be allowed a reduction of 25% on

the rates specified in table B of this Tariff.

3. Ships woned by th eSomali Government or Somalı Nationals but operated by foreigners will not benefit from the tariff reductions stated in paragraphs 1 & 2 article 7 chapter IV as above.

4. Ships calling at the port on account of stress of weather, or disabled, or with mutinous crews, or for medical assistance without discharging or loading goods and passengers will be charged 25% of the normal rates after 12 Hrs free stay.

5. Ships calling for slipping, reparing, beaching, examination cleaning or painting will be charged one-

half of the ordinary rates.

6. Ships calling for the sole purpose of taking oil or caal for Bunkers ship Stores provisions or water will be charged one third of the normal rates specified in Tables (B&C) of this tariff.

# Article Excemptions

- 1. Ships calling for the sole purpose of loading, discharging embarking or disembarking mail and passengers in the outer anchorage will be excempted from entrance and port dues. But should any such vessel load or discharged cargo, she will be chargeable in full rate.
  - 2. War ship of all nations will be excempted from specified entrance and general service charges scheduled (B&C).

Chapter V Mooring Charges Article 9 Application

1. Mooring charges will be levied on vessed ente-

ring or leaving the harbour, or making movements within the harbour.

2. The need to use the mooring facilities whether it be boats or staff, will be decided by the harbour pilot who is handling the vessel a tthat time.

# Article 10 Reduction

Ships moving from one berth to another or shifting from berth to buoys and vice versa will be charged one-half of the normal rate.

# Article 11 Excemption

Should the use of mooring facilities be for the sole purpose of port convenience, there will be no charges for such services.

# Chapter VI Berth Occupancy Article 12

1. Berth Occupancy charges will be levied on ships for the period of time they remain fast in the berth.

2. Berth occupancy charges will be calculated on the ships Oal in meters. All fractions of a meter will be considered as a meter.

3. Roll on off ships when not berthed alongside at full size of their legnth are allowed 15% reduction on rate shown in table G of this tariff.

# Article 13 Exceptions

War ships of all nations that use the berths for the sole purpose of courtesy, taking bunker or provisions or for medical assistance will not be charged berth occupancy for the first 24 Hrs after which such charges will be levied in full rates.

Chapter VII Pilotage

Article 14

# Application

Pilotage will be levied on ship entering or leaving

# Article 15

# Compulsary Pilotage

The use of pilot services is compulsary in all the deep water harbours of the Somali Democratic Republic.

# Article 16

# Excemptions

Compulsory Pilotage will be excempted from:

- Vessels whose NRT does not exceed 200 a)
- All fishing vessels b)
- c) All Sailing dhows
- d) National War Ships
- e) Ships having valid certificate of Compulsory Pilotage excemption, issued by the Somali Port Authority.

# Article 17

# Reductions

Ships shifting berths within the harbour will be charged onehalf (1/2) of the normal rates specified in table (E) of this tariff.

# Article 18 Pilot Detention

Where the services of a pilot have been requesetd at a given time and provided at that time, and the ship through no fault of the port Management does not utilise this service within half an hour of such time, the charges shown in table (C) will be levied for each half an hour or part thereof after the first half hour of detention The port Management may forego this attendance charges where it sees fit to do sofor reasens arising from act of good.

# Article 19

When a ship is moved solely for the convenience f the port no charges will be made for pilotage service

# Chapter VIII Towage

### Article 20

The use of tugs vessely entering for the purpose of loading or discharging goods and mail, embarking or disembarking passengers taking bunkers or provisions or entering for assistance of any kind will be compulsory.

### Article 21

Towage for shifting vessels

For vessels shifting berths or moving from one point to another within the harbour will be charged one-half of the normal towage rates specified in table (D) of this tariff. There will be no charges if the movement is for port convenience.

# Article 22 Exceptions

Compulsory towage will be excempted from:

- a) National war ships
- b) Sailing dhows
- c) All fishing vessels
- d) Pleasure yacths and domestic craft;
- e) Vessels whose NRT does not exceed é 200

Article 23 Waving Charges

The port management may excempt compulsory tug service from a nominated vessel on application in special circumstances.

# Chapter IX

Hire of cranes and other Mechanical cargo

Handiling Equipment

Article 24 Quay Cranes

The use of quay cranes where available will be compulsory for All vessels loading or discharging goods in door wat

# Article 25

# WAVING CHARGES

The Port Management may rule out the use of quey cranes where it sees inconvenient or uneconomical, e.g. for sailing dhows. In such cases, however, the Management may recommend or instruct the use of mobile cranes or ship derricks which ever may be convenient or economical.

# Article 26

# EQUIPMENT USED OUTSIDE PORTS

Charges on mobile cranes, Forklifts, tractors or trailers used outside the port area will be levied during the hours of daylinght or the total period that the machine may remain with the customer.

There will be no charge for night hours, unless it is sufficently proved that machine has been used actively during the night.

# CHAPTER X CARGO HANDLING GEAR Article 27

Cargo handiling gear, such as pallets, rope slings, net slings, wire slings and lashing chains may be provided to vessels on hire after a written request is received from the Ship's master or his agent.

# CHAPTER XI

# HIRE OF MARINE CRAFT

# Article 28

Outside normal operations Port's marine such as tugs, launches , lighters, etc. may be offered for hire, inside or outside the Port limits at the rates specified in table ( K ) of this tariff. Where special circumstanees so require, such rates migh be negotiated and covered by separate agreement under the sole tion of the Port Management.

# CHAPTER XII

# **STORAGE**

# Article 29

# IMPORT CARGO

Import Cargo will be given 5 Days of free Storage biginning from day, the Cargo is landed

# Article 30

Export Cargo & Empty Containers

Export Cargo will be given 5 days of free storage beginning from the day goods have entered the Port, or the Container has been stripped and the rates shows on table «S» will be applicable.

# Article 31 Storage Premises

Storage charges on import and export cargo will be applicable to all transit sheds. Open areas and over flow warehouses, and will remain due until shipment or delivery is effected.

# Chapter XIII

Cars and Other Mobile plant Article 32 Shore Handling/Lighterage

Shore handling or lighterage charges on cars, lorries, trucks and the other items shown in table (O) will apply to all such amchinery wheather packed or unpacked.

# Article 33 Stevedoring

Stevedoring charges on the items in table (O) will be collected in the same manner as the rates on general cargo stated in table (M1) Stevedoring of empty Containers is assessed in US.\$ as specified on table M2».

# Chapter XIV

D. II. T. . . . . . . . . . .

# Article 34 General Services

Crude oil and other refined petroleum porducts which may be pumped in or out by the ship's gear in bulk will be levied general services charges as stated in table (U) of this tariff.

# Article 35

Oil Bunker for ships

Oil pumped from land installations through pipes and supplied to ships in oil jetties for bunkering purposes will be charged the same rate as other bulk liquids shown in table (U) of this tariff.

Miscellanous Charges Article 36 Cleaning of ship holds.

Cleaning of ship holds will be made by the port labour after a written request made by the ship's master or his agent is received, and the rates shown in table (L) will be applicable.

# Article 37

Rigging of ship derricks

Rigging and snatching of ship derricks may be made by the Port labour after a written request has been made by ship's master or his agent, and the rates shown in table (L) will be applicable.

# Article 38 Opening and closing of ship hatches

Ship hatches may be opened and closed by the port labour after a written request is made by the chin's master or his agent and the charges specified in table (L) of this tariff will be applicable.

# Article 39

# Heavy Lift Charges

In addition to all other relevant charges prescri-

lift charges per ton (DEADWEIGHT) on each single package whose weight is 5 tons or over.

The rates specified in table (L) of this tariff will

be applied thereto.

# Article 40

# Passenger Charges

Passenger charges prescribed in table (L) of this tariff will cover one person and 2 packages of personal affects carried by hand.

# Article 41

# Lighterage Operations

Shore handling charges on cargo discharged or loaded in lighters, from ships in outer anchorage in the protected waters of the inner harbour basin will be charged 25% extra lighterage on the rates specified in table (N) of this tariff.
